As part of these efforts, my office has created this “Veteran Resource Guide” to provide you with key information about federal, state, and community-based programs.

I am committed to supporting military families in the Silver State and have secured funds for projects that directly benefit service members, veterans, and their families. I have fought to hold contractors accountable for failing to provide safe, privatized military housing and to improve resources for military families.

For Nevada’s veterans, I co-sponsored the Forever G.I. Bill that expands higher education opportunities and the Deborah Sampson Act to increase availability of VA services for women veterans. Additionally, I advocated for over \$270 million for rural veteran health initiatives, \$206 million for suicide prevention efforts, \$2.95 billion to improve VA disability claim processes, and \$86.5 billion for the VA to continue to serve our veterans who have given so much to our country. I hope you find this guide helpful. VA HEALTHCARE SYSTEM IN NEVADA

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has divided Nevada into three healthcare systems to better serve the veteran community. The VA Southern Nevada Healthcare System serves Southern Nevada with a medical center, women's health center, primary care clinics, and community-based outpatient clinics, including in Laughlin and Nye counties. The VA Sierra Nevada Healthcare System serves most of Northern Nevada. Northeastern Nevada, including Ely and Elko, is served by the VA Salt Lake City Healthcare System.

For increased access to care, VA offers Telehealth and TeleMental health services to communicate with your provider at one of the eligible VA community based outpatient clinics. Virtual appointments are also available via mobile phone through VA Video Connect, the VA's encrypted application. Caretakers can also participate in VA Video Connect virtual appointments. My HealtheVet is an online communication resource to be connected to your Patient-Aligned Care Team (PACT). After you complete your enrollment, you can request refills and communicate any updates with your primary care provider team. SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY AND PENSIONS

Under the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA), disability compensation and pensions are benefits that may be paid to a veteran due to injuries or health issues that developed while on active duty or that were made worse by active military service. These benefits are tax-free. Veterans may be eligible for disability compensation if they have a service-connected disability.

DISABILITY COMPENSATION

A veteran may be eligible for disability compensation through the VA if the veteran is at least 10 percent disabled and the disability is a result of military service.

SURVIVOR BENEFIT PLAN

The Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) allows a retiree to set aside a portion of his or her monthly retirement income to provide for a spouse or other eligible recipient after the retiree's death.

DEPENDENCY AND INDEMNITY COMPENSATION (DIC)

The survivors of a veteran may be awarded Dependency and Indemnity Compensation if they are dependents of any of the following:

- Service members who died while on active duty
- Veterans who died as a result of a service-related disabilities
- Certain veterans who are receiving 100% disability compensation from the VA at the time of their death

EDUCATION

MONTGOMERY G.I. BILL CHAPTER 30

POST 9/11 G.I. BILL CHAPTER 33

The Post-9/11 G.I. Bill provides financial assistance for education and housing costs to veterans who completed at least 90 days of active service on or after September 11, 2001, or 30 days for any veteran who has been discharged with a service-connected disability. A veteran must have contributed to this program to be eligible.

- REAP Eligibility Credited Toward Post-9/11 GI Bill Program
- Purple Heart Recipients after 9/11/01, are eligible
- Priority Enrollment, Work Study Expansion and more

EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE AND VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION PROGRAMS

Our service members should be focused on their important missions, not worrying about how to find a job when they complete their service.

VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION AND EMPLOYMENT (VR&E)

The VA may provide assistance finding suitable employment to veterans with service-connected disabilities. This program is referred to as Chapter 31 or VocRehab. For veterans who have severe service-connected disabilities, VocRehab provides assistance to improve their ability to live as independently as possible.

The following are some of the services that a veteran may apply for:

- Job Search
- Vocational Evaluation
- Career Exploration
- Vocational Training
- Education Training
- Rehabilitation Service

HOW TO APPLY FOR VA'S VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION PROGRAM

Eligible veterans and service members may apply for either vocational rehabilitation or employment benefits or for education/career counseling online through eBenefits. It's simple to apply. Just follow these steps:

- Log in to your [eBenefits](#) account.
- Select "Additional Benefits" from your Dashboard.
- Select "Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Program" - be sure to read the program information and to update your contact information - and apply for either the "Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment Program" or "Education/Career Counseling".
- If it is determined that you are eligible, you will be invited to attend an orientation session, in-person, at the nearest [VA Regional Office](#).
- Service members who have a disability that began or became worse during active duty and who have not yet received a service-connected disability (SCD) rating do not need to wait to apply. See [VA Form 28-0588](#) for further instructions.

For Service members: Ill or injured Service members who have not yet received a SCD rating do not need to wait to apply. Service members expecting a discharge that is other than dishonorable who possess a VA memorandum or [Integrated Disability Evaluation System \(IDES\)](#) rating of 20 percent or more—as well as Service members currently going through a Physical Evaluation Board—may be eligible to receive VR&E services.

Qualified veterans and unmarried surviving spouses of a veteran who died of service-connected disabilities may be eligible to have their home loans guaranteed by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). A Certificate of Eligibility (COE) is needed to apply for a VA Home Loan. Veterans can request a COE from within their eBenefits account.

SERVICEMEMBERS CIVIL RELIEF ACT

Veteran borrowers may be able to request relief under the *Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA)*, formerly known as the *Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act (SSCRA)*. The SCRA provides service members with certain legal protections while they are on deployment orders. SCRA can provide protection from foreclosures and some contracts.

You should contact your nearest Armed Forces Legal Assistance Program office to see if the SCRA applies. Dependents of service members can also contact or visit local military legal assistance offices where they reside.

In order to have your SCRA case reviewed by the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), you must first seek the assistance of your military legal assistance office. If that office cannot resolve the complaint, it may choose to forward the complaint to the DOJ. The DOJ then will review the matter to determine whether DOJ action is appropriate.

BURIAL BENEFITS

- **Burial Flag:** The VA will provide an American flag to drape over the casket of an eligible veteran.
- **Reimbursement of Burial Expenses:** The VA may pay a burial allowance of \$2,000 if a veteran dies due to service-related causes. The VA may pay \$300 for funeral expenses and \$300 for a plot.
- **Burial in a VA National Cemetery:** Veterans and dependents may qualify to be buried in any VA national cemetery.


TAX EXEMPTIONS

VETERAN TAX EXEMPTION

The State of Nevada offers a property tax exemption to eligible veterans, disabled veterans and for surviving spouses of veterans. The exemption can be up to \$20,000 and can be applied to a veteran's or surviving spouse's vehicle tax or personal property tax.



MILITARY TRANSCRIPTS

CORRECTING OF MILITARY RECORDS

To request a correction to a military record, the veteran, survivor, or legal representative must file a DD Form 149. It is the applicant's responsibility to prove that there is an error in the military record and the applicant must provide related evidence to the appropriate military review board.

DD Form 149 may be obtained at any VA Office or online with the National Archives: www.archives.gov/veterans/military-service-records/correct-service-records.html

REVIEW OF DISCHARGE FROM MILITARY SERVICE

To request changes, corrections, or modifications to discharges or dismissals that were not sentenced by a general court-martial, the veteran, survivor, or legal representative needs to file DD Form 293. It is the applicants' responsibility to provide related evidence to the board. If more than 15 years has passed since discharge, a Correction of Military Records must be submitted to their respective military branch.

DD Form 293, and DD Form 149 if applicable, must be mailed to the appropriate military branch's review board.
