- 8 (a) SUBMISSION OF INFORMATION.—In the event9 that the President grants an individual a pardon for an

1 offense against the United States that arises from an in-2 vestigation in which the President, or a relative of the 3 President, is a target, subject, or witness, not later than 4 30 days after the date of such pardon, the Attorney Gen-5 eral shall submit to the chairmen and ranking members of the appropriate congressional committees all materials 6 7 of an investigation that were obtained by a United States 8 Attorney, another Federal prosecutor, or an investigative 9 authority of the Federal Government, relating to the of-10 fense for which the individual is so pardoned.

(b) TREATMENT OF INFORMATION.—Rule 6(e) of the
Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure may not be construed to prohibit the disclosure of information required
by subsection (a) of this section.

(c) APPLICABILITY.—Subsection (a) shall apply with
respect to a pardon granted by the President on or after
January 20, 2017.
